Notes for the Quiz Master

On behalf of Humanity & Inclusion, thank you for taking on the role of Quiz Master for this fundraising quiz. These notes are designed to help with the smooth running of the quiz. We hope you have a fantastic event.

Preparation

- Bring some spare pens in case teams don't have one.
- Check how to use the microphone before the quiz (if you are using one).
- We suggest that you ask for a donation of £4 or £5 per participant.

Format

- There are 4 rounds of 10 questions (including a picture round) and one round of five questions.
- When collecting the donations, hand out an answer sheet and the picture round sheet to each team (6 answer sheets and picture round sheets are provided as part of this pack). Teams can start working on the picture round whilst you are setting up.
- The usual format is to have three rounds and then a short break before completing the final rounds (the quiz should take no more than one hour).
- You can score the first few rounds and picture round at the end of the half time break. Alternatively you can wait and score the full quiz at the end.

Introduction

- "Welcome to the (INSERT NAME) quiz on behalf of Humanity & Inclusion who have supported several million people with disabilities and other vulnerable people since 1982".
- Explain the format and timings; the scoring system; any prizes; remind quizzers to put their team name on their answer sheet and picture round; a gentle reminder (if necessary) that quizzers should not use their mobile phones.

During the quiz

- Read out the question number before each question.
- You should ask at the end of each round if there are any questions that need repeating.
- Make sure all the teams can hear you!

Notes for the Quiz Master (page 2)

Scoring

- Ask the teams to swap their answer sheets with another team for scoring.
- Read out each question followed by the answer.
- Each correct answer scores one point.
- Use your discretion over misspelled answers. Usually they are fine as long as they are close to the answer.
- Collect up all the answer sheets at the end and order them according to the total score. It is traditional to read out the answers in reverse order.

Tie-break question

- If two or more teams have the same number of points at the end of the quiz you can ask the following 'Tie-breaker' question. The winning team will be the one with the closest answer.

Question: 'Last year, how many people were supported with rehabilitation care by HI teams?'

Answer: **528,158**

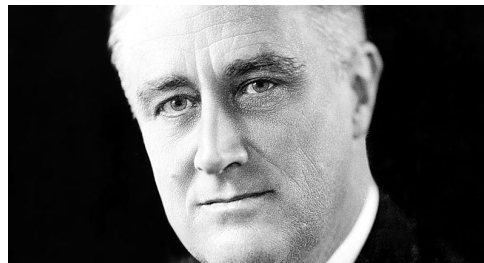
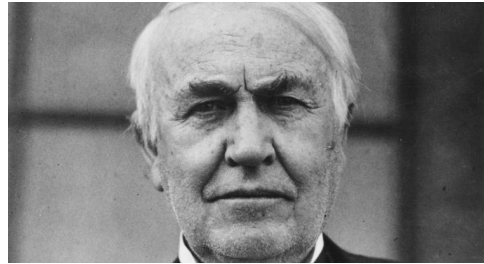
